DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Work within a Team Approach Under direct supervision of Clinical Supervisor & Program Director

- Provides full continuum of care services: Assessment, Intervention, and Outpatient Treatment: Family Therapy (group & individual), Facilitate Family Treatment Curriculum with group and individual, Follow up, Recovery Supportive Services.
- Provides consultation and collaboration with outside agencies for treatment services.
- Develops individualized treatment plans, aftercare plans, client case facilitation, and complete all documentation in timely manner utilizing Practice Management/EHC system for clinical and data management.
- Participate in a Multidisciplinary Team approach providing Strength based treatment services to individuals, and groups.
- Maintains a professional standard of conduct; adheres to the NAADAC code of ethics and/or other Mental Health code of ethics.
- Develop and manage Family Programming for youth & families.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Has current knowledge of ASAM placement criteria, familiar with DSM-V /ICD-10 and diagnostic tools used in the addiction/mental health field.
- Knowledge of the philosophies, practices, policies and outcome of most generally accepted and scientifically/ researched models of treatment, recovery, family therapy, and other Co-Occurring/substance-related problems: working knowledge of 12-step philosophy, theories, concepts and principles of a variety of therapeutic models.

- Knowledge and understanding of culturally relevant approaches to treatment of Native Americans using the Red Road and traditional methods of healing.
- Understanding of diverse cultures and incorporating the relevant needs of culturally diverse groups, as well as people with disabilities into therapeutic services.
- Must have strong group facilitation skills to work with Native People: adults, youth and families within treatment and community settings.
- State of Wyoming license or equivalent: LCSW, Family Therapist, LPC, LAT/LPC (dual licensure) or Psychologist with knowledge of wide variety of service delivery; including Telehealth services.
- Have the ability to interpret and follow all federal, state and agency regulations regarding client confidentiality, client's rights and procedures for client protection.
- Good written, verbal communication skills and an ability to interact as part of multi-disciplinary team. Computer knowledge is necessary for all documentation.
- Understand the addiction/ mental health professional obligation to adhere to ethical and behavioral standards of conduct as required by licensure.
- Familiar with medical and pharmacological resources in the treatment of substance use and mental health disorders.
- Understand and apply agency specific policies and procedures for handling crisis or dangerous situations, including safety measures for clients and staff.
- Develop and maintain ongoing supervision and continuing education in intervention and treatment processes

- Applications are available online at easternshoshone.org and can be sent via email to lmorgan@easternshoshone.org until 4:45 PM on the closing date.
 - **Supporting documents:** Driver's License, Tribal ID, High School Diploma/GED, Degree or professional credentials and other supporting documents that verify required qualifications.
- Applicants who have a current application with supporting documents on file **must** submit a letter of interest. The letter should address how you meet each qualification. **Telephone calls are not accepted in place of an employment application or letter of interest.**
- Preference will be given to a qualified Eastern Shoshone tribal member, then other qualified federally recognized Indian tribal members and then other qualified candidates. Applicants must submit a copy of Tribal Enrollment card or CIB for Indian Preference.
- Veterans who meet the minimum qualifications and provide documentation of an honorable discharge (DD214) from any branch of military service are entitled to receive preference points during the interview process.
- Applicants being considered for employment will be required to pass an alcohol and drug test and a background check. Refusal to take the test or testing positive will render the applicant ineligible for employment with the Eastern Shoshone Tribe for 60 days.
